Esher Sixth Form College 2024 UCAS Apply deadlines

Students **must** have a **face-to-face** (*in person or Teams*) **HE discussion and checking meeting** with a member of the Progression Guidance team **before** paying and submitting their form. **No forms will be processed** until the form has been checked. Please note our 'turn around' time commitment is only valid for forms submitted **without errors**.

Applications can be submitted from the start of teaching in the autumn term, Monday 11 September 2023.

Type of application	You must submit your form beforeand we will send your form to UCAS
Medicine, Veterinary Science, Dentistry and Oxbridge applications	8am on Wednesday 27 September 2023	by the UCAS early deadline of Monday 16 October 2023
Competitive applications (<i>if you want your form to be processed with 10 working days</i>)	8am on Monday 9 October 2023	within 10 working days of the form being received, provided it is error-free
General applications	8am on Monday 6 November 2023	by the end of the autumn term, Weds 20 December 2023
General applications - final deadline	8am on Monday 27 November 2023	by the UCAS final 'equal consideration' deadline, 31 January 2024

We will endeavour to process forms submitted after Monday 27 November as quickly as possible but **cannot guarantee** they will be submitted by the UCAS deadline of 31 January 2024.

Most universities continue to accept applications beyond the UCAS deadline, but are **not obliged** to consider them. Popular courses will almost always have filled up so these institutions won't accept late applications. For many courses and institutions, a policy of '**first come, first served**' does seem to apply. An early application for any course at any institution therefore optimises the chance of receiving an offer. However, it is better to make good choices and visit open days than to rush the form.

If a student is still unsure of which course to apply for, or whether indeed to apply to university at all, they are advised to make a **direct to clearing** application on results day in August, or a **post-results application** in September 2024, as a '**6.3 applicant**'. Help and Unifrog access will always be available to the student as a former member of college, and a 6.3 UCAS registration session will take place in early September 2024.

Art Foundation Course Applications are due in during the Spring Term 2024. Each Art College has its own deadline.

A level results day is likely to be Thursday 15 August 2024.
